The internationally known sculptor, Rockne Krebs, will discuss several of his recent laser sculptures including "Sun Dog" at the Corcoran Gallery and School of Art auditorium on Wednesday, May 4 at 8 pm. The lecture is free and open to the public.

"Sun Dog" is the only work of art ever commissioned by the National Endowment for the Arts. It was installed at the John F. Kennedy Space Center, Cape Canaveral, Florida for the U.S. Bicentennial Exposition of Science and Technology.

The sculptor, through the use of three projectors, will attempt to convey the complete experience of this important work. Mr. Krebs will also discuss and show slides of his other pieces in Atlanta, Georgia and St. Petersburg, Florida.

This lecture will give the Washington public its first opportunity to become acquainted with the sculptor's recent works in public places. The pieces to be discussed will include "Atlantus," "Canius Major," "City Scale," "Starboard, Home on the Range Part VI," and "Sun Dog."
